1991 - 1992 Monday Night Net Report

Monday, August 17, 1992, marked the first anniversary session of the N.F.A.R.L. Monday Night Net. After the net, I got busy gathering together the 1991 - 1992 net reports for review. Thanks to a good spreadsheet program, a nasty cut-and-paste job turned into one of simple data entry and resorting.

The final net statistics for 1991 - 1992 are very interesting, and prove that the N.F.A.R.L. Monday Night Net has become well established in our area. Each week, a dedicated group of participants check-in to lend their time, expertise, and support to this activity.

Of the 53 nets held during the past operational year, I have reports on 49 nets. One net was opened, but soon closed due to problems with the 145.47 repeater, and there were three net reports that were not filed with me. Therefore, the statistics noted here are based on the 49 completed reports that I have on file. BTW, the one dropped net due to repeater problems was prior to the decision to make the 147.06 Roswell repeater the back-up net repeater.

The 1991 - 1992 net stats are as follows:

Some of the more interesting highlights of the operating year were:

- 1) that the smallest nets did not all happen during the 1991 baseball playoffs or World Series,
- 2) that the average number of check-ins and average length of a net has almost doubled in the past year,
- 3) that the largest net we had occurred back when there was severe weather in the area and the net became a good source of information for local amateurs,
- 4) that the net had 760 total check-ins for the year, and
- 5) that 161 individual stations accounted for those 760 check-ins.

What is not shown is that, of the 161 stations having checked-in, about 35 - 40 stations are regular supporters of the net, checking in at least twice a month. Additionally, these stats prove that the N.F.A.R.L. net has indeed become a first rate net with more regular support than many long established nets around the area. If you aren't a regular net member, or haven't yet checked into the net, check it out. I believe that you will find it is well worth 30 minutes of your time each week.

During the net, we provide time for announcements, a swap shop, and discussion items. The nets are generally lively, particularly when there is current news about activities affecting the amateur community, or bad weather is in the area. The net is a good source of information.

One additional item I would like to note is that I have now identified the top 10 net supporting stations. I have placed these stations on the Monday Night Net Honor Roll, and each station will receive a certificate of achievement at the October club meeting.

Additionally, for the top net operating station of 91-92, I have prepared a special certificate, which I am calling the TOP OP award.

The determination of the Honor Roll stations was calculated using the number of times each station checked-in, and how many times each station had an announcement, swap shop, or discussion item. The Top Op award is a combination of overall score, and a bit of personal opinion on my part of which station contributed the most to the overall success of the net during the prior operational year. I hope that these awards become an annual event, recognizing those extra special efforts that contribute to the success of the N.F.A.R.L. Monday Night Net. To this end, all net stats are reset to zero at the beginning of each operating year. If you haven't participated in the Net, now is the time to begin building towards a possible award next year.

future hopes are that the geographical area served by the Net will grow as other W.F.A.R.L. repeaters are linked to the .47 machine. One such attempt will be made by Don, KD4APP, to link his 440 repeater on High House mountain to .47. If this can be done, coverage for the net will be extended to N.E. Alabama, S.E. Tennessee, western North Carolina, and western South Carolina. The future of W.F.A.R.L. repeater and net operation does indeed look bright and interesting for the coming year.

Again, to those 161 stations that have helped make the Monday Night Net a success, thank you. You have made my job as Net Control much easier. In fact, the more stations that check-in, the more fun the Net. To those stations that have yet to participate, I hope to see you on the air this coming year.

All Sessions are Walk-in

General Testing Information

The administrative procedures of all the Metro Atlanta exam sessions are very similar to each other. The following information should be applicable to all those listed with this flyer, and is current as of January 13, 1992.

- 1) All of the sessions are walk-in, i.e., there is no pre-registration required.
- 2) Please bring identification that includes a picture of the applicant on the ID - drivers licenses are quite satisfactory. Parents should provide some form of ID for non-driving minors.
- 3) Bring both original and copies of any current amateur license and any Certificates showing credits from a previous exam that you need to have counted toward a possible new license.
- 4) Calculators are allowed, but you must be able to show the exam team that the memories of any programmable calculators have been cleared before the exam starts.
- 5) All needed forms will be supplied by the exam teams - it is not necessary for you to bring an FCC Form 610. Pencils and scratch paper are supplied at several of the sessions, but you should probably have at least one pencil or pen of your own.
- 6) An examination fee will be charged at each session if the applicant takes any elements above the Novice level. This fee is for the entire session, not per individual element. The amount does vary, and is detailed below.
- 7) You should arrive at the exam site at least 15 minutes before the scheduled start of the session to begin paperwork processing. No one will be admitted while a code exam is being given, and a code exam, once given, will usually not be repeated that day, even if you are late.
- 8) Please keep in mind that the team members are all volunteers and are donating their time and effort to help you obtain your license. They make every effort to be professional and efficient in the exam process, but they ARE volunteers. We are blessed with more frequent test sessions here in Atlanta than probably anywhere else in the country, so a lot of folks are putting in their time. We enjoy doing it, or we'd simply quit, but an occasional "thanks" makes it that much more enjoyable.

Site Directions:

1st Saturdays, 9:00 a.m., Jonesboro: from I-75 S. of Atlanta, take the Ga. Hwy 54 exit, go south 2.6 miles; look for 2 traffic signals close together, turn left at the 2nd signal onto East Dixie Drive (NOT Dixie Dr). Go 0.1 miles east to end of E. Dixie. Exams are at Clayton Co. Emergency Management Bldg across the street (several antennas). There will be signs to the exam area. Examination Fee: \$5.00. VEC: Central Alabama VEC (CAVEC).

1st Sundays, 2:00 p.m., Lawrenceville: from the junction of Ga. Highways 316 and 20, go west on 20 (toward Buford) .5 mile; turn right onto Swanson Rd; Jackson EMC is .1 mile on right, 461 Swanson Rd. Examination Fee: \$5.00. VEC: W5YI VEC.

1st Monday Nights, 7:45 p.m., Roswell/Marietta: St. Ann Catholic Church is between Roswell and Marietta on the north side of GA 120, about 1 mile east of Merchants Walk - Johnson Ferry Rd area. Test site is on right side of complex behind the Sanctuary. Exam Fee: \$5.40. VEC: ARRL/VEC.

2nd Saturdays, 8:30 a.m., Stone Mountain: from I-285, go east on Stone Mountain Freeway (US 78) to the 3rd exit (Ga 10, Memorial Dr, St Mtn Business District); exit right. Take first exit from GA 10, East Ponce de Leon, and turn left at top of ramp; after .5 mi E Ponce takes sharp right curve around convenience store, crosses old Memorial Dr at traffic light, and becomes Main Street Stone Mountain. Go one more block to next light, turn right on West Mountain Street, cross the railroad tracks; Stone Mountain Methodist Church parking lot is on right very close to tracks. Examination Fee: \$5.00. VEC: CAVEC.

3rd Saturdays, 9:00 a.m., Southern Tech: Take exit 112 from I-75 (3rd exit north of I-285), go West on South Loop 120 (signs indicate Southern Tech). You will cross Cobb Pkwy/US 41 after .6 mile; entrance to Southern Tech is about .25 mile further, on left up grassy slope. The road forks at top of slope, take left fork. The first building on the right is the Student Center; park across street to left and go to the left of the Classroom Building, past Library (on your left), and find Building H - Academic Building behind Library. Exams are down one floor, Room 8-123. Examination Fee: \$5.00. VEC: CAVEC

4th Thursday Nights, 7:00 p.m., Lithonia: From I-20 take Evans Mill Rd North through Lithonia, cross railroad tracks, turn right, then next left onto Bruce St. The old Bruce St School, now DeKalb Co Police East Precinct, is .5 mi on right at 2484 Bruce St. Go past school, turn right around fence and park in lot outside fence. Come through fence gate, enter rear door, go to Classroom A, 3rd door on left. Examination Fee: \$5.00. VEC: CAVEC.

4th Sundays, 2:30 p.m., Church of the Atonement: From I-285 go South on Roswell Rd (toward Atlanta) about 1.2 miles; turn left onto Forest Hills Dr, go until it dead ends into Highpoint Rd. Turn right, and the church is about .2 mile on the left. The entrance is at rear of office building. Exam Fee: \$5.40. VEC: ARRL VEC.
