Help us shine in 2009 – The new club officers under the leadership of WB4MAK have many old and new activities in the planning stages for 2009. Build-a-thons, shack tours, hamfests, field day, and many more will require your help while you're having fun. We're considering special interest groups within the club, such as DX, CW, QRP, foxhunting, VHF contesting, antenna parties, young hams, satellites, and soldersmoke to name a new. Contact the Club Officers to tell them what you want to do.

**Mid Month Madness** – Techfest – January 10th ... NFARL will be supporting the GARS TechFest for the 3<sup>rd</sup> straight year. This year we are honored to operate their Special Event Station – W4T. We'll be setting up two stations – 40M and 20M using both ends of the equipment spectrum. First, we'll have an SDR 5000 software defined transceiver, the most modern of amateur radios. Second, we'll feature a KWM-2 Collins tube transceiver from the early 60s. This will be set up as a "beginner" station with the bare essentials. The SDR station will have full computer support, graphics, and software tools. Take you pick! We'll need to erect 2 antennas in record time. Displays open at 10 AM and so does our station, maybe earlier. We need at least 6 people dedicated to doing the antennas. **MMMM** – **More Mid Month Madness!!** HamCram – General class edition on January 17 starting at 8 AM... If you are a TECH class now or expect to be by then, enroll in this special HamCram... and we do mean CRAM! There is much material to cover and we're not sure it has ever been done in ONE DAY, but let's go for it – think positive! You must register by the end of this year because there is a set of notes that you need to go through THREE times before the event. The cost is \$22 which covers a pizza lunch and the test administration at 4 PM. Enroll online at nfarl.org and click on HAMCRAM.

**VE sessions announced** – Our **VE** coordinator, **VErne (W8BLA)**, has set the dates for 2009 testing. The first is January 17, the same day as HamCram. This is followed by March 14, May 16, July 18, Sept. 19, and November 14. All are held at the EOC behind Fire Station #1 on Webb Bridge Road, which was our old meeting location.
