This is just a friendly reminder regarding your membership. It was 25 weeks ago that we moved all of our membership to the NFARL.ORG web site from the QuickBooks environment. We have tried to make sure that all the bits and bytes are in their proper places for each membership record. This means that you should receive an automatic renewal notification 30 days before your membership expires. However, as with all database migrations, there will be exceptions. If you feel that your name is not on the membership roles, and should be, or it is incorrectly categorized, please send a note to N4CLA @ NFARL dot ORG. The other piece of this is that your name will automatically fall off the membership role exactly 365 days after you last renewed. You can automatically renew your membership at www.nfarl.org/mart.

Please log in and update your membership record with any changes. This is your record. If you have moved, or your phone number has changed, or you want to change your User Logon or password, you can literally change any of this information. Your membership expiration is also located on www.nfarl.org and choose MEMBERS in the left column. If you have forgotten your password you can ask the system to send you a new one time password.



NFARES 2009 SIMULATED EMERGENCY TEST A SUCCESS!

The North Fulton Amateur Radio Emergency Service (NFARES) conducted its 2009 Simulated Emergency Test (SET) on Sunday, October 24, 2009. This was a test of amateur radio communication support for five cities in North Fulton County. These cities included; Sandy Springs, Roswell, Alpharetta, Johns Creek and Milton, Georgia. Each city had its own net control station that gathered simulated (test) messages from each locality and then forwarded them to other jurisdictions within the simulated tornado disaster area.

During the drill, 34 local amateur radio operators participated in the three hour exercise that included communications links between, sixteen Fire/Rescue and local law enforcement agencies, Northside, Emory Johns Creek and North Fulton Hospitals.
