Many of us enjoy chasing DX or just making good conversation on HF, we participate in contests, some of us enjoy supporting bicycle and foot races while "playing radio", and some of us (thankfully) are dedicated to the art of emergency communications. There are so many ways to have fun and enjoy our hobby. One of my favorites is chasing Satellites! 2015 has been a great year for Amateur radio satellite operators! The long awaited launch of AmSat's Cubesat Fox1A, now known as AO-85, was a tremendous success and this satellite has been a great addition for satellite operators, especially those of us that like to work

the FM repeater satellites. The Chinese have inserted another 9 Cubesats into orbit and we are currently enjoying the FM repeater on LilacSat-2 and the SSB transponder on XW-2F. We anticipate more of these Chinese satellites may become available in the near future and AmSat is expected to launch at least one more Fox program Cubesats in 2016. It's a great time to be working "the birds" and you can do it with an HT and handheld antenna!
