

Special Interest Groups (SIGS) Coming in January!



Antenna SIG: The long anticipated NFARL Antenna SIG will kickoff at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, January 30. Have you always wanted to know <u>HOW</u> antennas work? Do you want to know why some antennas <u>WORK WELL</u> and others don't? Do you want to know how to pick the <u>BEST</u> antenna for your needs? Do you want to <u>EVALUATE</u> the wire antennas you are now using? Would you like to <u>DESIGN and BUILD</u> your own antennas? If you answered YES to at least one or two of these, the Antenna SIG could be for you. You

<u>don't</u> need a EE degree to participate. All you need is a keen interest, a desire to learn, a willingness to do some guided in-depth study and the ability to participate in weekly meetings. To learn more about the Antenna SIG including how to sign up, click <u>here</u>.



CW SIG: Again in 2010, the club will sponsor a CW class for those interested in this aspect of ham radio. Not for everyone, CW is still finding a crowd of hams who joined the hobby after code was eliminated but who wish to find out why anyone would enjoy CW! After K4BKD talks to us at the January meeting about "10 reasons to try CW", the CW SIG will kick off 2 days later at W4QO's QTH for the first of 6 weekly sessions. This SIG is along the lines of a support group as you study the code. If you sign up, you should be prepared to spend at least 20 minutes per day, 5 days per week.

Each week new letters will be introduced and members will use CDs and the M-W-F CW net at 8PM on the 145.47 repeater for 20 minutes. Since sending is important to learning the code (10 minutes per day), members will be encouraged to obtain or build a CPO/keyer/paddle for their use. Some loaners will be available. So join us at 7PM each Thursday beginning on January 21 to get in on this fun mode. Sign up via email at w4qo@nfarl.org or during the January meeting at the CW SIG table. You may also study along at home IF you can't come to the meetings. Just follow a syllabus that we'll provide.

Youth Night: The February 16 NFARL meeting is being designated Youth Night with emphasis on recognizing our young enthusiasts. The program that night will be a Mr. Wizard style show about electricity and will be especially fascinating to younger members (and guests). This is just a friendly reminder regarding your membership. It was 33 weeks ago that we moved all of our membership to the **NFARL.ORG** web site from the QuickBooks environment. We have tried to make sure that all the bits and bytes are in their proper places for each membership record. One thing that we have noticed is that there seems to be several people that have created new profiles. Please do not do this. If you can not remember what you profile is, please contact <u>n4cla@nfarl.org</u> and I will help you get into your profile. Do not arbitrarily just create another profile. Next, you should receive an automatic renewal notification 30 days before your membership expires. If we know you are an ARRL member and that is indicated in your profile, you will also receive a reminder about the expiration of your ARRL membership as well. However, as with all database migrations, there will be exceptions. If you feel that your name is not on the membership roles, and should be, or it is incorrectly categorized, please send a note to <u>n4cla@nfarl.org</u>. The other piece of this is that your name will automatically fall off the membership role exactly 365 days after you last renewed. You can automatically renew your NFARL and ARRL memberships at <u>www.nfarl.org/mart</u> anytime. It does not have to be after your notification. The renewals are just added to the existing membership.

Please log in and update your membership record with any changes. This is your record. If you have moved, or your phone number has changed, or you want to change your User Logon or

password, you can literally change any of this information. Your membership expiration is also located on <u>www.nfarl.org</u> and choose <u>MEMBERS</u> in the left column. If you have forgotten your password you can ask the system to send you a new one time password.

ARRL: Our percentage of ARRL membership in the club is now at **70%**. We highly encourage you to become an ARRL member and support your National organization. These are the people that help protect our/your frequency allocations with the FCC. They also provide a nice monthly publication for your membership. It is called QST. If you are not a member of the ARRL, please consider supporting them. You can make your ARRL membership renewals on our <u>www.nfarl.org/mart</u>.

Name badges: If you have been considering ordering your NFARL Name Badge, now would be an ideal time to do it. These badges have magnetic backs so they will not poke holes in your clothing. They are NOT etched badges as they are made using a photographic full color process, and the information on the badge will NOT wear off. This is an example of what the badge will look like, but with rounded corners and NO black border.



So if you are interested, they are \$9.00 each. All you have to do is
