MMM – **Mid Month Madness!!** You say 'What is this Mid Month Madness? Well, Mid-Month Madness is a great way to increase your learning and technical skills in a hands on fashion. Join the North Fulton Amateur Radio League on the first Saturday of each month for an exciting amateur radio activity. Some of our past activities included an antenna building party, kit building, and shack tours. These have all been well attended events that offered amateur radio operators exciting ways to learn more about ham radio.

At the antenna building party people had the opportunity to build a wire antenna from scratch. Hams built antennas for 80 meters, 40 meters and 40/20 meters. Everyone had a great time, learned to build and tune an antenna, and learned best practice construction techniques. Here are <u>pictures</u> of the antenna building party.

Then at a recent kit building session, hams with all experience levels, were able to successfully build a crystal testing RF oscillator. Some people who attended the event had zero experience with kit building and soldering. Our youngest builder was only ten years old. Here are <u>pictures</u> of the RF oscillator kit building session.

Our next kit building session offered construction of a sound card interface to enable digital modes like PSK31 or a frequency counter with a digital readout. Some of the advanced builders were offered surface mount (SMT) construction techniques.

We've also held shack tours of the ham radio shacks of various club members. These shack tours are excellent ways to get ideas of how you can incorporate new ideas into your personal shack. Recently Mack McCormick, WB4MAK, opened his shack to club members. The morning began with a breakfast and then a tour and demonstration of Mack's shack. Mack operates on all bands 160M to 23cm on all modes including CW, SSB, AM, FM, D-Star, and all digital modes. Everything in Mack's shack is computer controlled and automated. Over 50 hams attended the event.

So, for our March Mid-Month Madness, on Saturday March 7th, we'll meet at Location yet to be determined for a pancake breakfast to package the Joule Thief kit for our club fund raising project. NFARES Update - On Saturday, February 7th, 14 Hams (11 of which belonged to NFARL) provided communications to the Chattahoochee Nature Center for the Chattahoochee Challenge 2009 Run. The run was uneventful (no one was injured), and several runners expressed their appreciation that the Hams were willing to come out so early and "freeze their fannies off" just to make sure that the run was completed safely.

Jim Paine and Steve Knittel of NFARES volunteered their time the weekend of January 24-25 to assist the North Fulton CERT Teams in practicing emergency exercises. Their main focus was to

teach CERT members net protocol while using walkie talkies. Tom Koch also volunteered his time to create a Powerpoint presentation to assist in teaching net protocol.

On February 4th, in observance of National Severe Weather Awareness Week, the NFARES group conducted a severe weather net at 9:00 a.m. The net was run out of the Sandy Springs EOC. There were 15 total check-ins. 2 remote from Brunswick and Cleveland, GA using D-Star and 13 from Roswell, Alpharetta, Northside Hospital, Emory Johns Creek Hospital, and surrounding areas.
