Earlier in the year, Bob Gross, KE4EM, contacted club leaders looking for assistance with some tree trimming around his antenna ropes. A group of members from a Hungry Hams lunch agreed to stop by Bob's QTH one Wednesday afternoon to scope out the work. We discovered why Bob was looking for assistance.

Bob has a nice antenna farm set up on his property. Bob lives in a HOA governed subdivision, and his antennae are all of wire construction. They include a 40M loop, end feds, and dipole. Bob's property is wooded and has about a 60 foot change in elevation. All of the antenna trees are on a fair amount of sloped ground. Additionally, Bob's antenna mounting points are very high on these trees.

After noodling the situation with the club members present at the site survey, we decided it would be worthwhile if a professional arborist/climber were contacted for a quote. John, KQ4OSG, reached out to a contact he has, and Silv agreed to provide Bob with a quote. Bob and I decided to look for other options as the price for the professional work was beyond the budget limit.

As the window of leafless tree trimming began to draw to a close, another opportunity arose. I was performing some tree work at my QTH and needed to extend my pole saw length. I have an aluminum swimming pool vacuum attachment pole. It was something that has followed me from residence to residence over the years. It extends to 22 feet in length and is rigid enough that it doesn't flex too much under side loading. I was able to mount a tree pruning saw and limb cutter attachment (sacrificed from a Harbor Freight donor tool) onto the pole and discovered it worked well. This prompted me to contact Bob and let him know I wanted to try it on the work at his QTH. Bob had already offered the use of his extension ladder, saws and other tools (ropes, etc.), so we wouldn't need to carry much to the job. Bob also cleared the ground around the target trees and moved antenna lines to make trimming easier.

Lee N4WYE agreed to assist me with the work. We met at Bob's on "a perfect weather for the job day" and got to it. About 4-½ hours later we finished up trimming all the tree growth and called it a day. Everyone was satisfied with work completed. We left Bob with a promise to return to correct any missed trimming and Bob offered to help the club with any mentoring or presentation work we might need.
